In response to the COVID-19 (Coronavirus) pandemic Hindmarsh Shire Council has cancelled its scheduled council meetings due to be held on 1 and 22 April 2020 and 10 June 2020. Meetings scheduled for 13 May and 24 June 2020 will be moved to the Nhill Memorial Community Centre, if they are able to go ahead. It may be necessary for these meetings to take place unless the Victorian government makes changes to council budget timelines.

Because of the need for council staff to be relocated or redeployed in order to continue providing essential services, the telephone operating system for customer service will be closed from 12.00 noon on Thursday 9 April over the Easter break and reopen at 10.00am on Wednesday 15 April 2020. Customer service phones will be operational between the hours of 10.00am and 3.00pm from Monday to Friday from 15 April until further notice.

Although on-site works for the establishment of final plans for the Wimmera River Discovery Trail have been delayed due to COVID-19, other infrastructure works for the Dimboola Visitor Node component of the project are continuing. These works include the new public amenities that will be established behind the new Dimboola Library and a new bus shelter in Lochiel Street to replace the previous shelter that was removed from behind the library.

Rainbow Radar now live

The Rainbow Radar was installed in 2020 outside the town of Rainbow to provide world-class weather intelligence for the Wimmera Southern Mallee region.

The radar assists with flood and severe weather warnings, emergency services management and general weather forecasting.

These improved weather services will provide significant benefits to the Wimmera Southern Mallee agriculture sector along with aviation and other parts of the transport sector, emergency services, and the general public.

The radar project is a whole of community effort, supported by the Wimmera Development Association, funded jointly by the Victorian and Federal Governments and delivered and operated by the Bureau of Meteorology.
