Upcoming Public Holidays

Dimboola Community Civic Hub

Work is well underway to refurbish Dimboola's circa 1860's built Old Shire Hall that until recently housed the Dimboola Library and Council Customer Service Centre.

When refurbishment is completed, the building will transform into the Dimboola Community Civic Hub that will be linked to the new Dimboola Library / Council Customer Service Centre.

The Dimboola Community Civic Hub will become a multi-purpose facility that will be available for corporate and community meetings and training, exhibitions, trade shows, business development programs and displays, etc.

This project has been made possible with funding from the Federal Government's Community Development Grants program and Hindmarsh Shire Council.





Jeparit Service Centre & Library Upgrade

Works have commenced on the upgrade to Council's Jeparit Customer Service Centre, located at the Jeparit Hall in

This project will see several areas transformed with a completely new customer service area providing a significant office upgrade and a new library service to be incorporated in to the Jeparit Senior Citizens Room (as a shared space). The popular Billiard table will also be retained, with a protective cover to be installed to protect the table when operating as a Library facility.

The Customer Service Centre and Library will be accessed via a new all abilities accessible ramp and deck leading to an auto door entry on the south west side of the building.

A new kitchenette, upgraded heating and cooling and extensive electrical works will also be completed as a component of the project which is being undertaken by local builder Leyonhjelm Building Services.

This project has been made possible through funding from the Victorian Government's Living Libraries program and Hindmarsh Shire Council.

Nhill Library Update

New carpet has been installed throughout the Nhill library during the closure, instantly increasing the overall appearance of the space. Shelving from the old Dimboola Library has been installed into the Nhill Library and furniture has been rearranged to create a larger open space for future activities.



Albacutya Bridge

Hindmarsh Shire Council has recently received funding from the Federal Government under Round 5 of the Bridges Renewal Program (BRP) and Round 7 of the Heavy Vehicle Safety and Productivity Program (HVSPP).

Amongst twenty projects across the Mallee that received funding, Council has received funding of \$2 million for the upgrade of Albacutya Bridge and Albacutya Road. Funding will allow for a new dual carriage way bridge with a total project cost of \$4.15m including \$1.3m from the state government.

Council has been advocating for a number of years for the upgrade to Albacutya bridge following an engineer's report deeming the bridge unsuitable for vehicles over 15 tonnes.



Upgrade Completed at Dimboola Early Learning Centre

Internal upgrades have been completed at Dimboola Early Learning Centre which will help to meet increased demand for early year's services as enrolments continue to grow.

A reshuffle of service locations within the centre will help meet future needs, with a previously underutilised space repurposed for childcare services. A project delivering a new kitchenette, bathroom and sleep room has been now been completed along with the relocation of the Maternal Child Health office (still within the same building).

The changes provide greater flexibility for Hindmarsh Shire's early years' service provider Emerge to deliver both 3 and 4 year old kindergarten programs for Dimboola.

This project has been made possible with funding from the Victorian Government's Children's Facilities Capital Program and Hindmarsh Shire Council.

Upgrade Underway at Nhill Early Years Centre

Contractors have almost completed works at the Nhill Early Years Centre on a project that will provide greater flexibility for service provider Emerge Early Years Services.

This project encloses a little used outdoor space to provide an additional indoor area, which will support increased capacity in adjacent kindergarten and childcare rooms. It will also provide the opportunity to create a new sleep room as the need arises.

Wimmera River Discovery Trail and Development Update

The Wimmera River Discovery Trail has a number of aspects that all link to each other to establish the trail. Nodes will be developed at Dimboola and Jeparit, with a pedestrian bridge on the northern end of the trail near Lake Hindmarsh.

Council has established a project-working group to oversee the project while at the same time; an external project-working group consisting of key stakeholders including BGLC, Parks Vic, DELWP and WCMA was also established.

Council officers have been undertaking Cultural Heritage Management Plans with external stakeholders, and have completed on site assessments of the trail infrastructure requirements.

A budget of \$1.2M has been allocated to establish the Wimmera River Discovery Trail which will be a 63km trail along the corridor of the Wimmera River from Dimboola to Lake Hindmarsh via Jeparit. Works are expected to be completed by 31 December 2021.

Funding of \$600,000 has been received from the Federal Governments Building Better Regions Program, \$400,000 from the Victorian Government's Regional Partnerships and an allocation of \$200,000 from Council.

Additional Tree Plantings

Tree plantings planned for years 3 and 4 as part of Council's 2018 Street and Reserve Tree Strategy, have been brought forward while additional resources, such as the working for Victoria staff are available and budget allows.

206 additional new trees have been planted across Rainbow, Jeparit, Nhill and Dimboola in recent weeks making a total of approximately 320 new trees planted this financial year.







Construction Works Update

The construction team have completed all underground drainage and concreting works in Charles Street Jeparit and are now waiting for more favourable weather conditions so the parking lanes can be prepped and sealed.

The concrete crew have moved to Lake Street Rainbow where they are installing a new concrete footpath from Taverner St to Railway St on the North side, while also completing some sundry debtor works in Dimboola.

The new concrete footpath on Lake St Rainbow, between Railway St and Taverner Street will improve links for pedestrians removing the need for them to walk on the grass or finding an alternative route.



Grader crews have been busy completing a new road and carpark for the Albacutya Silo art trail and also concreting some pram crossings at the intersection of McPhersons and Campbell streets Nhill.



Rohde and Croots roads have been resheeted along with the Diapur road shoulders on Easticks Hill, all of which received 100mm of new gravel.



Quarry raising has been going well with 20,000m3 raised at the Gerang quarry while another 20,000m3 is underway at Robinsons quarry near Rainbow.

When calling for advice it is paramount that you provide an address and as many other details of the proposal as possible.

The advice provided will be general in nature.

If more specific advice is required, it is best to complete a 'Request for Planning Advice' form which can be located on our website. There is a fee of \$150 associated with this form however, following assessment of the information the advice will be provided in writing.
