
LIBRARY NEWS

No time limits apply for library visits, but face-masks are required at all times.



YURUNGA HOMESTEAD FUNDING ANNOUNCEMENT

The heritage listed Yurunga Homestead has been successful in attracting \$185,000 funding through the Victorian State Government's Living Heritage Program. This funding will provide urgently needed stabilisation works to the homestead's structure. The soils of the Rainbow district are silty clay that



results in many older stone buildings in Rainbow showing various degrees of cracking in their walls. This has been exacerbated on the kitchen and laundry walls at Yurunga over the years through water drainage, making them increasingly unstable.



The popular Rainbow tourist attraction has had sections of the homestead closed from tours due to these structural concerns. The homestead was built in 1908 from local limestone and its unique construction style has required specialist restoration work to allow visitors to enjoy all of the heritage site and minimise any further damage.



HINDMARSH SHIRE NATURE STRIP POLICY

Hindmarsh Shire Council has updated its Nature Strip Policy. Nature strips are known as the land between the edge of the road and the property boundary. Council asks that residents maintain the general upkeep and presentation of their nature strips.

LOCAL LAWS UPDATES

FIRE PREVENTION INSPECTIONS

Councils Municipal Fire Prevention Officers are commencing property Fire Inspections from early October. Every property in the Hindmarsh Shire will be inspected for potential fire hazards in the front and rear yards.

If a hazard is detected the owner of the property will be issued a Fire Prevention Notice which will require specific works to be undertaken in a set timeframe to eliminate the hazard.

If the resident does not comply with the Notice in the given time frame, a penalty notice to the value of \$1,867.00 may be issued. Council officers will arrange for properties failing to comply with the Notice to be cleaned up to a safe standard at the property owner's expense.

If you have concerns regarding vegetation on a particular property, you are welcome to contact Council on (03) 5391 4444 to speak to a Local Laws team member.

ANIMAL REGISTRATION CHECKS

Hindmarsh Shire Council Local Laws officers are currently undertaking door knocking to follow up on unregistered dogs and cats over the age of 3 months. They are also checking on animals that have not had last year's registration renewed.

PROJECT UPDATES

RAINBOW LIBRARY CONSTRUCTION UNDERWAY

The new Rainbow Library is starting to take shape with the concrete slab for the building being poured on Friday 27 August. There will now be a short pause in on-site activities allowing the concrete time to cure properly before the commencement of framing works. The Library will add a fresh new look to the bottom end of Federal St and future landscaping works will also help to link the site with community hub The Oasis.

ALBACUTYA BRIDGE DELAYS

Due to current COVID-19 restrictions, the Albacutya Bridge construction project is on hold until restrictions are lifted for construction workers, who are now unable to travel from metropolitan areas into regional areas.

SWIMMING POOL AND SPA COMPLIANCE INSPECTIONS

Hindmarsh Shire Council are pleased to let residents know that Shane Ledgar has been appointed as Council's Swimming Pool Compliance Officer.

To improve the safety of pools and spas,



the Victorian regulations changed on 1 December 2019. From that date, if you own a property with a pool or spa you were required to register the pool/spas with your local Council by 1 November 2020.



The first round of Pool and Spa inspections are due to be completed by November 2021.

PLANNING AND DEVELOPMENT

Some planning permit applications require a period of advertising, particularly if the proposal is likely to affect neighbouring properties or the wider community. This gives anyone who feels that they would be adversely effected by the proposal a chance to object.

Did you know that under the Planning and Environment Act 1987 (Section 51), anyone can inspect an advertised planning permit application and accompanying documents free of charge? They can be accessed over the duration of their advertising period (approximately 14 days).

NON-MAINS ENERGY CONCESSION FORM 2021

Concession card holders who source non-mains energy for their heating, cooking and hot water can apply for a concession to help cover their yearly energy costs.

What does this concession apply to?

Non-mains sources of energy:

- liquefied petroleum gas (LPG)
- firewood for domestic heating, cooking or hot water
- heating oil
- electricity accessed via an embedded network
- generator fuel.

Who can apply for the concession?

An account holder who holds a Pensioner Concession Card, Health Care Card and/or Veteran's Affairs Gold Card can apply for this concession.

To apply for this concession, you must complete a Non-Mains Energy Concession 2021 form. These are available for collection at all Hindmarsh Shire Council offices or can be found online here: services.dffh.vic.gov.au/non-mains-
