FUNDING ANNOUNCEMENT

Hindmarsh Shire Council is very excited about the announcement of funding from the Federal Government for upgrades to Nhill-Jeparit Road and Dimboola Rainbow Road.

Council has long advocated for the upgrades to these roads and we look forward to the improvements of driving conditions on rural highways.

The works on Dimboola Rainbow Road involve improving safety along a 15.2km section by widening both sides of the road and resealing. Works are expected



to commence on Monday 13 September and will run through to November 2021.

Works on Nhill-Jeparit Road involve improving safety along a 6.2km section by widening both sides of the road and resealing. Works are expected from September to November 2021.

Road users may experience disruptions between 7am and 5pm Monday to Friday.



RAINBOW LIBRARY **CONSTRUCTION UNDERWAY**

The new Rainbow Library is starting to take shape with the concrete slab for the building being poured on Friday 27 August. There will now be a short pause in on-site activities allowing the concrete time to cure properly before the commencement of framing works.

The Library will add a fresh new look to the bottom end of Federal St and future landscaping works will also help to link the site with community hub The Oasis.

AMENITIES UPGRADE AT NHILL **CARAVAN PARK**

Stage 1 of a project to upgrade the Amenities building at the Nhill Caravan Park has been completed with the male facility now completely refurbished. New toilet and shower facilities, flooring, wall panelling and ceilings have been installed, providing future park guests with a fresh new bathroom experience.

Stage 2 of the project, which will see similar upgrades applied to the Female facilities will commence in early September.







RAINBOW CARAVAN PARK REDEVELOPMENT UPDATE

Planning for the redevelopment of the Rainbow Caravan Park is progressing well with Hindmarsh Shire Council and electricity supplier Powercor currently working through the design stage of a power supply upgrade which will increase capacity at the Rainbow Recreation Reserve and Caravan Park.

The power upgrade will be the first stage of a multi-faceted project that will ultimately see the redevelopment of the Rainbow Caravan Park.

Council has allocated funding to upgrade the power supply into the Rainbow Recreation Reserve and Caravan Park. The power upgrade will provide sufficient power for future developments including the new joint use change rooms that will be located within the grounds of the caravan park but used by participants utilising the adjacent netball and tennis courts.

WIMMERA RIVER DISCOVERY TRAIL UPDATE

The Wimmera River Discovery Trail is a 62km cycling/walking trail linking Dimboola to Jeparit through to Four Mile Beach at Lake Hindmarsh. The trail incorporates mostly existing trails and vehicle tracks along the Wimmera River Corridor. The majority of the trail is on Native Title land that is co-managed by Barengi Gadjin Land Council and Parks who have been strong Victoria supporters and partners in the project from the initial planning stages. The Trail implementation has been jointly funded the Federal Government, Victorian Government and Hindmarsh Shire Council.

The trail will include upgraded visitor nodes in Dimboola, at the rear of the library (completed), and Jeparit at the 'swimming hole' opposite the Jeparit Caravan Park. It is also planned to install a new footbridge in Jeparit to cross the Wimmera River near the old rail bridge, giving visitors and locals the opportunity to view, appreciate and learn about the old rail bridge as are crossing nearby.

The Wimmera River Discovery Trail will offer a unique experience of the riparian environment along with the significant Cultural heritage and importance of the Wimmera River to the Wotjobaluk peoples.

It is expected to attract visitor numbers to Dimboola and Jeparit and increase the visitor economy in those and surrounding towns. It is a priority project from the Grampians RDV Region Cycling and Trails Strategy and an important attraction to help grow the greater region as a cycling destination.

CAMP KITCHEN EXPANSION AT RIVERSIDE HOLIDAY PARK

Visitors to Dimboola's Riverside Holiday Park are set to benefit from further improvements at the popular tourist facility on the banks of the Wimmera River. Contractors have recently completed a project to extend the existing camp kitchen with the addition of an all abilities accessible bathroom.

The new bathroom provides shower and toilet facilities for park patrons regardless of their mobility, in a convenient location adjoining the park's public camp kitchen. The bathroom also includes a change table which will be a handy addition for families with young children utilising the camp kitchen.

NEW STREET FURNITURE TO BE **INSTALLED IN JEPARIT**

In conjunction with the Jeparit Town Committee, Hindmarsh Shire Council will commence installing new street furniture throughout Jeparit in coming weeks.

The street furniture replacement is a continuation of a program to replace outdated concrete and timber seating across the Hindmarsh Shire with the new seats constructed of powder coated steel frame and fitted with modwood (composite plastic and timber) slats.

In most circumstances the new seats will be located where existing seats are but there will be others installed in new locations.

The Jeparit Town Committee has requested for some of the existing seating that is being replaced to be relocated and re-used at various locations around Jeparit including the Wimmera Mallee Pioneer Museum and the Jeparit Cemetery.





OUT AND ABOUT

MAINTENANCE WORKS UPDATES

Jeparit, Rainbow and Dimboola Maintenance teams have been completing grader work in Antwerp and Gerang areas.

Council's Town Maintenance Team have been planting new trees, patching up pavement and completing edging repairs around townships, and on top of their normal duties, have been completing additional COVID cleaning.

The Roadside spraying program has started up to prepare for fire season.

The Nhill Maintenance grader team completed a limestone re-sheet on sections of Propodollah-Netherby Road and have since moved on to the Broughton area. Another grader crew is currently working around the Woorak area.

The Town Maintenance and Capital Works teams have both been completing earthworks at the Nhill Aerodrome to create a new hardstand for the firebombing planes during fire season. Works are expected to be complete before the fire season is here.



CAPITAL WORKS UPDATE

The construction team are currently working on two concrete projects in Dimboola. The team working on the Anderson Street kerb and channel is close to finishing the kerbing, and once complete, works will begin on shaping and constructing the roadway.

The second concrete project being undertaken is upgrading the kerbing and footpath at the Normanby and Lloyd Streets intersection. This is also close to completion.

The grader crew has recently completed a gravel re-sheet on Propodollah Road and is now planning on starting back on the sealed road construction projects (weather permitting).

OVERPOPULATION OF CATS IN HINDMARSH SHIRE

Did you know that cats can have kittens as young as four months of age, and can have up to five litters per year?

If cats do not get desexed it can result in a huge number of unwanted kittens each year. Unexpected or unwanted litters usually end up in animal pounds, depleting resources that otherwise be used to help other animals in need.

Desexing your cat can also reduce urine spraying, aggression and roaming of neighbourhoods. Having your cat desexed also protects it from certain illnesses and diseases.

Kittens can be desexed from as early as 12 weeks old.

SWIMMING POOL AND SPA COMPLIANCE INSPECTIONS



Hindmarsh Shire Council are pleased to let residents know that Shane Ledgar has been appointed

Council's Swimming Pool Compliance Officer.

To improve the safety of pools and spas, the Victorian regulations changed on 1 December 2019. From that date, if you own a property with a pool or spa you were required to register the pool/spas with your local Council by 1 November 2020.

The first round of Pool and Spa inspections are due to be completed by November 2021.

PLANNING AND DEVELOPMENT **UPDATE**

The Development Team have been busy this last year with fifty four (54) planning applications received which was a 45% increase on applications received for the previous year.

Forty-three (43) decisions were made and these included permits issued for the following:

We are currently processing nineteen (19) active applications.

A copy of the Title is very useful, as are any site plans you may have that detail the proposed works and the setbacks to boundaries.

The advice provided will be general in nature.

If more specific advice is required, it is best to complete a 'Request for Planning Advice' form which can be located on our website. There is a fee of \$151.50 associated with this form however following assessment of the information the advice will be provided in writing.

NON-MAINS ENERGY CONCESSION FORM 2021

Concession card holders who source non-mains energy for their heating, cooking and hot water can apply for a concession to help cover their yearly energy costs.

What does this concession apply to?

Non-mains sources of energy:

- liquefied petroleum gas (LPG)
- firewood for domestic heating, cooking or hot water
- heating oil
- accessed electricity via an embedded network
- · generator fuel.

Who can apply for the concession?

An account holder who holds a Pensioner Concession Card, Health Care Card and/or Veteran's Affairs Gold Card can apply for this concession.
