Dimboola and Rainbow Skate Park- Official Openings

On Monday 9 and Tuesday 10 April 2018 Hindmarsh Shire Council held the official openings for the Rainbow and Dimboola Skate parks respectively.

It is estimated that nearly 200 people attended both openings that consisted of a broad range of younger children, teenagers, parents and grandparents plus interested residents.

Skate workshops were conducted at both events by Phil Marshall and Tobi Stanley from Melbourne based skate company OwnLife while Sunshine Coast, Queensland based Ben and Jake from Board Store / Trinity Skate Parks joined them for skate demonstrations. Clayton Farmer, proprietor of Trinity Skate Parks who constructed both facilities attended both openings. Horsham based Vornehm Audio Visual provided music at both events.

Hindmarsh Shire Youth Councillors Bridie O'Halloran and Jordan Leach acted as Master of Ceremonies at Rainbow while Danni Haebich and Kynan Clarke performed the role at Dimboola. All Youth Councillors did a great job.

The skate parks were identified as priorities in the Hindmarsh Shire Youth Council Youth Strategy 2016 – 2020 as a way of providing increased outdoor activities for youth. The skate parks were also prioritised in the Hindmarsh Shire Sport and Recreation Strategy 2016, the 2017 – 2021 Council Plan, the Dimboola Community Precinct Plan and the Rainbow Community Plan.

Construction of the Dimboola Skate Park commenced in December and was ready for use just after Christmas and construction of the Rainbow facility commenced mid-January.

Construction of the Dimboola and Rainbow Skate Parks was made possible with funding from the Victorian Government's 2017 – 2018 Community Sports Infrastructure Fund and Hindmarsh Shire Council.

Nhill Skate Park Funding Community Consultation

Following recent reports that Hindmarsh Shire Council has received funding for the construction of a new skate park in Nhill, there has been considerable discussion within the community in relation to the proposed location and design.

Council received advice from the Hon John Eren, MP Minister for Sport that funding of \$100,000 has been provided through the Victorian Government's 2018 – 2019 Community Sports Infrastructure Fund for this project. Council will contribute the balance of funds for the project.

A community consultation regarding developments about the new Skate park for Nhill occurred at the Nhill Memorial Community Centre on Wednesday 4 April 2018 commencing at 7.00pm. 22 participants attended and a diverse discussion was held.

This consultation allowed residents to ask questions and to gain an understanding of the processes already taken in developing the concept designs and site selection of the skate park.

Some items raised throughout the consultation included;

- The ideal location of the new Skate park
- Safety risks- including the availability of footpaths leading to the new facility and encouraging youth not to travel on their scooters, skateboards and BMX's along the road.
- Lighting
- The close proximity of the powerlines above the suggested location
- Fencing between the new facility/Jaypex park and the highway.

Further consultations will now occur before detailed plans are fabricated.



Walk to School Funding Application

Council has again applied for funding from VicHealth to facilitate the Walk to School program in our Shire for all of the participating primary schools. Given the success of the program the last three years, the schools are very excited to be involved again this year.

Last year students received a ticket for each day they walked, rode or scooted to school or the bus stop, some of the tickets were lucky which enabled them to win a prize. Students absolutely loved the idea of getting a ticket to see if they would win a prize. We saw participation numbers raise last year, with students excited to participate in this year's program. If the funding application is successful the program will occur during October.

Western Hwy Safety Improvements, Nhill	Council has received quotations and is currently working with contractors to install a unsigned pedestrian crossing connecting the West Wimmera Health Service Centre with the median carpark, including provision of all abilities car spaces. Works also include installation of an electronic warning sign and bollards on Nelson Street (Adelaide bound) at the Victoria Street approach – the well-known 90 degree left hand bend in the Western Highway.
Kiata South Rd sight distance improvements	Council engaged contractors have completed vegetation treatment on a number of bends on Kiata South Road where the vegetation was blocking sight distances around corners. These works hope to improve safety for motorists.
Bridge & Structures Audit	Council has engaged consultants to analyse Bridge & major structures across the shire. This includes many light towers & major culverts, a grandstand, retaining wall and several other miscellaneous assets. These are currently being inspected with a condition report to be followed. This will aid in understanding the detailed condition and any works required on these assets.
Sealing program	Council has completed re-sealing 112,000m2 of its road network. Resealing is important to ensure water is prevented from reaching the underlying road, similar to paint on a house.
Street Lights	18 new street lights have been installed around the Nhill Township to improve the safety of residents who walk to recreation areas during the night hours.
Commercial Carpark	Upgrades to the Commercial carpark are almost complete with only cleaning up tasks to complete. The upgrades are designed to improve the look of the CBD entrance whilst providing shade for parked cars.
