Albacutya Bridge Open to Traffic

Hindmarsh Shire Council's Chief Executive Officer, Greg Wood, and North Ward Councillor, Cr Ron Ismay, were on site at the newly constructed Albacutya Bridge on Monday 23 May as barriers were removed opening the bridge to traffic.

The Albacutya Bridge was permanently closed in October 2021 due to deterioration and was demolished not long after to allow for the new dual lane bridge to be constructed.

This project has been made possible with funding from both the State and Federal Governments and Hindmarsh Shire Council. An official opening will be conducted with representatives of federal government, state government and Hindmarsh Shire at a future date.

New Pod Seating Installed

Additional pod seating has been installed throughout the shire with a new seat installed at Bi-centennial community park in Dimboola and in the gardens on the west end of Federal Street, Rainbow.

Also pictured is a new seat located near the EV charging station in Nhill. Two more pod seats are to be installed at the swimming hole in Jeparit.

Funding for the Pods was received through the State Government's Outdoor Activation Grants.

OUT AND ABOUT



Antwerp-Woorak Road

Works are completed on Antwerp-Woorak Road with a 1.8km sealed construction of a previous gravel section.

Reseal Program

Our reseal program is underway with contractor Inroads completing the work. This is estimated to be completed in June.

Albacutya Road

Works are completed on Albacutya Road with a 1.2km sealed construction widening the narrow seal near the silo.

Lowan Street Dimboola

Works are completed on Lowan St in Dimboola sealing a gravel road. Monitoring of the seal will take place due to the cold wet weather and a further application may be required.

Scott Street, Jeparit - Kerb and Channel Works

The kerb and channel is installed with shoulders also sealed completing the project. Monitoring of the seal will take place due to the cold wet weather and a further application may be required.

PROJECT UPDATES



Nhill Caravan Park Cabins

Two new two bedroom accommodation units were delivered and installed at the Nhill Caravan Park last Thursday and Friday 5th and 6th May.

Connections of services to the two new units that include one standard accommodation unit and one fully accessible unit are expected to be available for use by the end of June.

Dimboola Riverside Holiday Park Cabins

Two standard two-bedroom cabins have arrived at Riverside Holiday Park this week increasing the number of two bedroom cabins to seven (six standard and one all abilities). Connections of services, fit-out of furniture/appliances and hand-over is expected to occur over the next six-weeks.

These are the 4th and 5th cabins to be delivered and installed in caravan parks throughout Hindmarsh Shire as part of the Victorian Governments Regional Infrastructure Fund. One more all-abilities cabin is scheduled to be delivered to the Jeparit Caravan Park next week.









Jeparit Caravan Park Cabin

A new all-abilities two bedroom cabin has been delivered and installed at the Jeparit Caravan Park. This is the sixth and final new cabin to have been delivered and installed at our Caravan Parks throughout Hindmarsh Shire over the last month as part of the Victorian Governments Regional Infrastructure Fund.

Parks and Gardens

The recent cold snap and onset of wintery weather has made conditions challenging for the Parks & Gardens teams. However, the Nhill Customer Service Centre has been lucky to receive newly planted roses along the garden bed in front of the Nhill Customer Service Centre on Nelson Street. The previous roses were damaged following a truck roll-over incident that occurred in front of the building earlier this year. Hopefully the rain helps them flourish!

Pigeon Problem

Council is currently trialing a noise-deterring system at the Nhill Memorial Community Centre (NMCC) as part of finding a solution to the pigeon problem.

We are in the early stages of trialing this system and are closely monitoring how much impact it may have on deterring the pigeons away from nesting in the roof of the NMCC.



Nhill Tennis Club Room Constructions

The new club room at the home of the Nhill Tennis Club in Turner St is beginning to take shape with preparations now complete for the pouring of the concrete slab which is set for this Thursday (subject to suitable weather).

Council was pleased to allocate some of its funding from the Federal Government's Local Roads & Community Infrastructure Program as well as provide Council funds and project management to ensure Nhill Tennis Club has a club room. Council was happy take on responsibility for the land, run the tender process, award the tender to a local builder and council staff have done a great job of installing a new access road for the project.

The new Club Room will be a welcome replacement for the original building which was demolished after storm damage made it uninhabitable several years ago. Members of the Club will be able to enjoy the tennis from inside the new Club Room or outside under the Al Fresco area. Also included within the development is a kitchenette, amenities facilities, All Abilities Accessible bathroom and storage area.

Rainbow Library Landscaping Underway

With the recently completed construction of the new Rainbow Library, landscaping works are slowly progressing with everything crossed for a completion date by end of June.

The new landscaping will provide a relaxing park like setting at the rear of the Library for visitors to relax with a good book or enjoy lunch, with park settings and picnic tables set to be included within the development.

A pathway to the Community owned The Oasis (old Primary School site) will also be developed, which provide an important link from Federal St to this area.

Development has unfortunately been a little slower than expected, with the contractor experiencing several COVID related delays with this and other projects. The landscaping design and installation has been made possible with funding from the Federal Government's Local Roads and Community Infrastructure Program.



Mallee Silo Art Trail - Rainbow Silo Development

Progress continues for the development of an innovative new Tourism Asset in Rainbow with the appointment of an Architect to lead the design of the project expected within the next 2 weeks.

The development, which will see a 100 year old concrete silo in Rainbow transformed into a large scale art installation complete with a lift and stairway leading to a viewing tower at the top of the Silo is set to become the highlight of the internationally recognised Silo Art Trail.

Council has a long term lease in place for the Silo with owner and local identity Llew Schilling and has secured funding from the Victorian Government for this ambitious project which is expected to be completed in early 2024. The appointment of the Architect will signal the start of the design process – with a concept design to be developed ahead of a Community consultation in the coming months.

Rainbow Lake Development Progressing

Development of facilities at the Rainbow Lake is progressing well with the septic system installed and the recent pouring of the concrete slab for the new toilet building. Local contractors will complete construction of the small toilet block in the coming months, along with the construction of a new BBQ shelter (and installation of a commercial grade gas BBQ). Park furniture and picnic settings have also been purchased for installation by the hardworking Rainbow Lake Committee.

These important developments, funded by the Federal Government's Local Roads and Community Infrastructure Program, are timely as water is now flowing in to the Lake on the southern outskirts of town in preparation for a big Summer of fun for locals of all ages.

The Victorian Fisheries Authority must also be acknowledged for their funding support which originally secured the water connection for the Lake and subsequent civil works providing lake reshaping and better access to the site. They will also provide additional support with the stocking of various fish species once the lake is ready.

Rainbow Netball Changes Rooms Under Construction

New Female Friendly change room facilities at the Rainbow Recreation Reserve are progressing well with the building now at Frame stage. The new change rooms, adjacent to the netball courts will provide participants with fantastic new amenities close to the action, a major improvement over the existing, dated facility which is too small at less than half the size and located over 250m away!

This project, scheduled for completion by Spring, has been made possible with funding from Sport and Recreation Victoria's Female Friendly Facilities program and Hindmarsh Shire Council.

Rainbow & Jeparit Library Return Chutes

You can now return your library items to the Jeparit and Rainbow Libraries out of opening hours!

A return chute has been installed to the left of the main entrance's sliding doors in Rainbow and on the main entrance door located at the south west side of the Jeparit Library building.




Lighting at Wimmera Mallee Pioneer Museum

Responsibilities as a Pet Owner



Did you know that?

- Owners of cats and/or dogs over three (3) months of age must be registered with Council. (All dogs and cats must be microchipped before they are registered).
- An owner of animals must ensure animals are kept on land that is securely fenced, or caged as necessary.
- Cats are required to adhere to a curfew; the curfew requires cats to be confined to the owner's premises between sunset and sunrise (overnight).
- Any dog or cat that is found to be roaming outside of the property boundary at any time can be considered a nuisance and 'at large' and may be caught by a resident or Authorised officer (using an approved cat cage for cats).
- An owner includes any person who has the animal in his or her care for the time being.
