The 2025 - 2035 Sport and Recreation Strategy is a long-term strategic plan that will guide Council and key stakeholders in developing and managing sporting and recreational facilities, programs and services within Hindmarsh for the next ten years.

HINDMARSH SHIRE COUNCIL GRANTS OPEN FOR APPLICATIONS

Hindmarsh Shire Council currently has the following grants open for applications:

Community Action Grants

This grant is to assist with community development, social action and connectedness. Funding can be applied for in one of three categories:

- Community Assistance up to \$1,000
- Event Sponsorship up to \$500
- Small Equipment up to \$1,000

Business Assistance Grants

This grant program aims to generate new employment opportunities, support business to grow and attract new business to Hindmarsh Shire.

Eligible businesses can apply for funding to support projects in one of two categories:

- Business Development up to \$2,000 (business must match \$1:\$2 to grant)
- Streetscape Improvement up to \$3,000 (business must match \$1:\$2 to grant)

Regional Community Events Grants

This grant program is for incorporated not-for-profit organisations to run Regional Community Events within Hindmarsh Shire across three tiers:

- Tier 1: \$2,000 for events expecting up to 500 attendees
- Tier 2: \$4,000 for events expecting up to 1500 attendees
- Tier 3: \$7,500 for events expecting over 1500 attendees

Applications for the above grants close 5:00pm on Thursday 4 September 2025.

2024/25 CAPITAL WORKS COUNCILLORS OUT AND PROGRAM DELIVERY

Hindmarsh Shire Council has reviewed the delivery of key projects under its budgeted 2024/2025 capital works program. Over 85% of items listed in the programs were completed during the financial year.

Major projects like Davis Park Grandstand and Llew Schilling Silo are well underway but were not completed at 30 June 2025.

Extensive road upgrades and resurfacing were completed across the Shire including resurfacing over 52,500 m2 of sealed roads.

Nhill Dog Park and Rainbow Rises Event **Centre** are now open!

Over 700 customer requests 400+ maintenance tasks were actioned by our outdoor team.

Some projects will continue into the 2025/2026 financial year due to approvals from external authorities or budget adjustments.

RAINBOW SILO TOURISM DEVELOPMENT UPDATE

Contractors are continuing with the fit out of the third and final section of the silo tower onsite at the Rainbow Silo, including installation of the stairs, platforms and balustrades. The lower-level platform providing access to the west silo bin has also been installed.

This project has been funded by the Victorian Government's Tourism Infrastructure Program - Flagship Projects and Hindmarsh Shire Council.



NHILL DAVIS PARK GRANDSTAND & CHANGEROOMS



After a number of unexpected delays, specialist concreting contractors have been on site at Davis Park in Nhill, installing formwork for the new suspended concrete grandstand. Formwork is a temporary structure that shapes and supports the wet concrete until it sets and gains strength.

Once the concrete work is complete, balustrades will be installed and seating will follow. The builder will then finalise the internal fit-out, which is already nearing completion.

Delays were due to contractor availability, as this part of the project was dependent on specialised skills. Council is working to ensure that the remainder of the project progresses smoothly.

This project is proudly funded by the Federal Government's Local Roads and Community Infrastructure Program, the Victorian Government's Country Football Netball Program, Hindmarsh Shire Council, and the Nhill and District Sporting Club.

NEW SIGNS WELCOMING PEOPLE TO NHILL



Thanks to support from the Nhill Town Committee, we are thrilled to have rejuvenated the much-loved 'Welcome to Nhill in the Land of the Lowan' signs that visitors and locals see when driving into Nhill along the Western Highway.



HINDMARSH OUTDOOR POOLS 2025/26 SEASON PLAN

Hindmarsh Outdoor Pools in Jeparit, Nhill, Rainbow and Dimboola are planning to open on **15 November 2025** for the summer season with FREE entry across all pools!




WHITEHEAD AVENUE SCHOOL CROSSING

Council officers are currently working to seek approval to upgrade the school crossing in Whitehead Avenue to a raised pedestrian crossing to improve pedestrian safety.

The recent traffic survey of this intersection has raised concerns about the pedestrian safety in the school precinct with traffic counters identifying the following:

- The road on average has over 635 vehicles per day with about 20% of them being heavy vehicles. On an average day, there are more than 110 trucks travelling on this road.
- About 9% of vehicles travelling on this road were travelling at a speed higher than the posted speed limit of 40km/hr. This non-compliance reached about 20% between 7am and 9am.



• The maximum speed of over a 100km/hr was detected in this section of road during the count period.

Council is currently working with GrainCorp to find an alternative route for heavy vehicles travelling between the Belcher Street bunker and the Whitehead Avenue silos.

The speeding non-compliance is putting pedestrians, including children, at a greater risk. We urge road users to abide by the speed limits and for pedestrians to be cautious while crossing the road.

ROAD MANAGEMENT PLAN 2025-2029 ADOPTED

The **Road Management Plan 2025-2029** was adopted by Council at its meeting on 23 July 2025. The purpose of this Plan is to establish a management system for Council to inspect, maintain and repair its public roads based on policy and operational objectives having regard to available resources.


