## **ROADS AND FOOTPATHS**

## **ROADS MAINTENANCE UPDATE**

Council staff have been busy undertaking work tickets on our road network throughout the Shire and now that the weather has improved these works include tree trimming, road grading and edge break repairs. Roads that are currently being worked on include Tarranyurk West Road (re-sheet), Millers Road (grading), Keams Road (grading) and Preston Road (grading).

## FOOTHPATH - BOW STREET, RAINBOW

Construction of a new footpath between King Street and Railway Street has commenced, good progress has been made by the concrete team and the work is on track to finish in August.



## FOOTHPATHS - HIGH STREET AND ELLERMAN STREET, DIMBOOLA

Contractors have begun the footpath works and the concrete has been poured on the High St section, with only the Ellerman St section remaining. Once all footpath has been constructed, Council staff will move on site to conduct the drainage works.


