

RAISED PEDESTRIAN CROSSING IN MACPHERSON STREET



Council will be commencing work on the installation of a raised pedestrian crossing (wombat crossing) on Macpherson Street in Nhill from the week commencing 8 September 2025.

This crossing will be similar in design and style to the raised pedestrian crossing near Centrelink in Horsham.

Due to the works on this crossing and the works currently being completed at Avonlea and the Hospital, we encourage residents to avoid the area if possible. There will be limited on-street parking available, and a speed limit reduction to 40km/h will be in place for the duration of this project.

This pedestrian crossing will help make it safer and easier for residents to cross the road with confidence, especially those heading to the nearby health service and aged care facility.

50% of this project has been funded by the Transport Accident Commission (TAC) and 50% by Hindmarsh Shire Council.

PROJECTS TO BE DELIVERED UNDER SAFE LOCAL ROADS AND STREETS PROGRAM



The Transport Accident Commission (TAC), in partnership with the Department of Transport and Planning (DTP), have developed the Safe Local Roads and Streets program for Councils across Victoria. This Victorian Government initiative has allocated Hindmarsh Shire Council \$2m for the development and delivery of road safety improvement projects on local roads with a safe system approach. The program is focussed on creating a safer environment for road users, including pedestrians, and hence is prioritising improving rural intersections, speed reductions, pedestrian crossings and footpaths.

In response to the opportunity, Hindmarsh Shire has worked closely with the TAC and DTP to develop safety improvement projects, taking into considering past community requests and notable safety issues within the municipality. Council officers prepared a list of projects which was scrutinised by TAC and DTP against the project guidelines.

Four projects have now progressed to the final stage of the application process and are listed below:

- Improvements of Nhill-Rainbow Road and Kruger Road intersection
- Improvements of Nhill-Rainbow Road and Solly Road intersection
- Raised pedestrian crossings to be installed in Nhill on Whitehead Avenue, Station Street and Davis Avenue
- Footpath construction on Park Street between Ramsay Street and Queen Street, including pedestrian crossings on Ramsay Street, Breda Street and Queen Street.

COUNCIL RATES NOTICES & COLLECTION OF ESVF LEVY

Residents in Hindmarsh Shire should have started to receive their annual rates notices for 2025/2026.

This year, we have included a brochure with your rates notice that provides more information on valuations and how to object to them, the Emergency Services and Volunteers Fund (ESVF) and rebate options available for ratepayers. The brochure is available online here.

Why is Council collecting the ESVF levy through their rates?

Although Hindmarsh has been strongly lobbying against the ESVF and having to collect this levy on behalf of the State Government, the legislation that passed in Parliament is written in a way that it is illegal for councils not to collect the levy.

What happens if I don't pay the ESVF levy?

If ratepayers don't pay the ESVF portion of their rates, the State Government still receive their money as every dollar paid to Council by the ratepayer will have a % remitted to the State. This means that Council rates will be considered outstanding, and it will be local services and works that miss out.

HINDMARSH THANKS BLAZEAID VOLUNTEERS



On behalf of the whole Hindmarsh community, particularly those around Nhill and Dimboola who were directly impacted, Hindmarsh Shire Council extends a sincere thank you to BlazeAid for their support, dedication and investment in the wake of the Little Desert bushfire.

BlazeAid set up a camp at the Nhill A & P Society grounds where they then spent the next six months assisting 40 properties that were impacted by the bushfires.

This consisted of over 228 volunteers working a total of 3,366 days where they cleared 68km of fencing and constructed 94km of new fencing.

Hindmarsh Shire Council also extends thanks to the Nhill A & P Society and all community groups and individuals who donated food and time to support BlazeAid over the past six months.

DONATIONS TO EBENZER & LOWAN CFA GROUPS



At the Hindmarsh Shire Council Briefing on Wednesday 13 August 2025, Mayor, Cr Ron Ismay, had the pleasure of presenting Russell Hunter of the Ebenezer CFA Group and Peter Duperouzel of the Lowan CFA Group with cheques of \$900 each. These proceeds were raised from the auction and BBQ at the Community Thank You Concert held in Dimboola earlier this year.

Following the January 2025 Little Desert National Park bushfire, a community concert and auction were held in March at the Dimboola Recreation Reserve, as a way for the community to acknowledge and thank the hundreds of CFA volunteers and emergency services personnel.

The CFA's District 17 has more than 80 brigades, with the Ebenezer Group consisting of Dimboola, Antwerp, Tarranyurk, Detpa, Gerang Gerung and Jeparit brigades, and the Lowan Group consisting of Nhill, Winiam, Diapur, Broughton, Propodollah, Yanac, Netherby, Lorquon and Woorak.

COUNCILLORS VISIT PYRENEES COUNCIL



On Wednesday 3 September 2025, Hindmarsh Shire Councillors visited Beaufort to meet with Pyrenees Shire representatives to discuss the housing development project undertaken over a 10-year period. The development involved multiple stages resulting in approximately 95 houses being built in Beaufort.

We know housing is an issue in our Shire, and Councillors came away with a lot to discuss on the potential for housing development in Hindmarsh.

CHEMICALS AND SPRAY DRIFT ON FARMS



With agriculture being a large and valuable sector of Hindmarsh's working industry, farming land can often back onto residential areas. 'Spray drift' is the airborne movement of agricultural chemicals as droplets, particles or vapour. A combination of factors can contribute to spray drift, including the volatility of the chemical, weather conditions, equipment and droplet size.

Farmers should be aware of these conditions and work to ensure that care is taken to prevent spray drift to non target areas that might damage neighbouring crops and native flora and fauna, and may pose a risk to people's health and safety.

Tips for farmers are available online on the Agriculture Victoria website, as well as information around what to do if spray drift occurs and other legal obligations.

COUNCIL PLAN 2025-2029 & ACTIONS 2025/2026

At the Council Meeting held on Wednesday 27 August 2025, Council adopted its Council Plan for the next four years. This Plan also includes our Municipal Public Health and Wellbeing Plan and our updated Vision, Values and Mission.

Council also adopted its 2025/2026 Council Plan Actions.

ABOUT THE COUNCIL PLAN

The Plan is structured around four (4) key themes:

- Our Community
- Built and Natural Environment
- Competitive and Innovative Economy, and
- Good Governance and Financial Sustainability

Each theme includes three (3) goals, supported by three (3) to four (4) priorities that outline the broad action areas we will prioritise to achieve each goal. These goals and priorities will guide Council's work over the next four years and will be reported on annually.

The Plan also includes Council's advocacy priorities for the next four years.

ABOUT THE ACTIONS FOR 2025/2026

The 2025/2026 Council Plan Actions outline proposed actions for the year and a roadmap for future years. While indicative actions are mapped out beyond 2025/2026, Council will consult annually to refine them and report quarterly on the progress of these Actions.

FREE GREEN WASTE MONTH IN OCTOBER

Between 1 October and 31 October 2025, Hindmarsh Shire Council is accepting green waste disposal FREE of charge at all Hindmarsh Transfer Stations.

This is a great chance to tidy up your properties, enhance our towns, and keep everyone safe during the fire season!

KNOW YOUR COUNCIL DATA EXPLAINED

Each year Council provides audited information for the Know Your Council website on a range of measures including Aquatic Facilities, Animal Management, Food Safety, Governance, Libraries, Roads, Statutory Planning, Waste Management, Financial Performance and Sustainability. Four years of data is provided for communities to compare Council against Council.

Hindmarsh Shire is aware of information circulating that does not provide the full picture, including costs of service delivery, outcomes of VCAT decisions, and staff turnover for all 79 Victorian Councils.

Kerbside Waste Collection Costs

- In 2023/2024, kerbside garbage collection in Hindmarsh Shire cost just over \$270 per bin, excluding recycling.
- Council collects 2,827 bins weekly across 7,500 sq/km via a local contractor in all four towns.
- Costs cover transport to Dooen landfill, gate fees, State Government landfill levy, and contractor operations — Council does not profit from waste services.
- Many larger councils have moved to fortnightly collection to reduce costs, but Hindmarsh's smaller scale limits cost-sharing opportunities.

Statutory Planning

- In 2023/2024, if you broke down Statutory Planning into cost per application this would be on average just over \$8,700 per planning permit.
- Statutory Planning Costs cover more than applications these include community enquiries, heritage overlay reviews, and planning scheme updates.
- Council received 32 planning applications in 2023/2024, mostly assessed by contractors.
- A new real-time permit tracking system and a newly graduated planning cadet will help reduce reliance on contractors.

VCAT Planning Decisions

- In 2023/2024, two Hindmarsh planning decisions were taken to VCAT.
- One decision was upheld, with VCAT agreeing to Council's permit and conditions.
- In the second case, VCAT directed Council to issue the permit after conditions were agreed by all parties.

Library Services

- In 2023/2024, library services cost just over \$62 per resident in Hindmarsh Shire.
- Council operates four libraries, three of which also serve as Customer Service Centres.
- Hindmarsh Libraries act as community hubs, offering social activities, internet access, and safe spaces for all.
- Investing in libraries supports the health and wellbeing of the community.

Staff Turnover

- In 2023/2024, staff turnover was just over 26% (24 staff), driven by retirements, career changes, and part-time staff graduating into full-time roles.
- The year saw the departure of the previous CEO and two interim Acting Infrastructure Directors.
- Ongoing retirements are expected each year due to the age profile of the workforce.

KERBSIDE GLASS COLLECTION DATES



Purple glass bins in Hindmarsh will be collected on the following days:

- Friday 24 October 2025
- Friday 9 January 2026
- Friday 10 April 2026

Residents can drop off glass for free at any transfer station or collection point in Hindmarsh if they cannot wait for collection day, or contact our team to discuss options for a second bin.



The Wimmera River Discovery Trail is close to fifty-six kilometres in length and connects Dimboola to Jeparit along the Wimmera River. It can be completed in sections.

The trail varies from well formed gravel tracks to loose sandy sections with a few challenging dips that may require dismounting and walking through.

Following significant rain events the trail may become muddy and impassable. It is also important not to attempt the trail on high fire danger days. Please check local weather conditions before setting out.

The trail is on Wotjobaluk Country. Some sections also cross private property. Please be respectful of all land you are crossing, stay on the trail and minimise any impact to the environment. Please ensure you bring all your rubbish home with you and leave the trail litter-free for everyone to enjoy.
